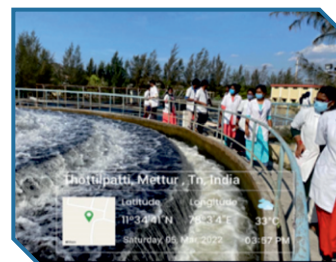
FACULTY ACHIEVEMENT :

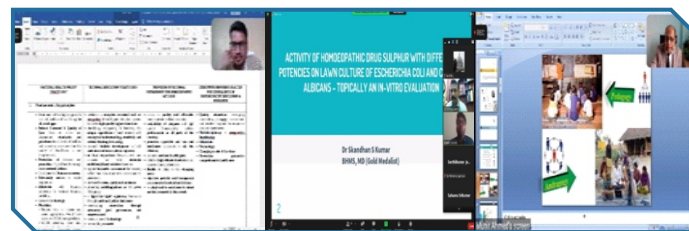
VINWISDOM-2022

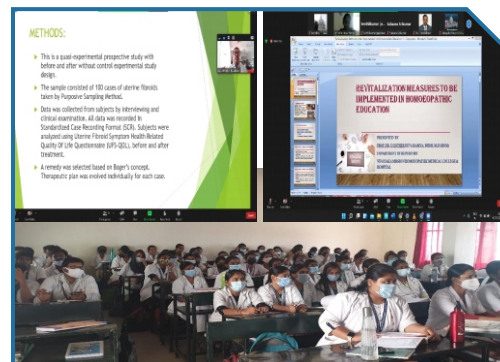
1st Day (16.02.2022):

AGROHOMOEOPATHY

Modern agriculture augments the need to produce more to meet the demand of increasing population, the Green revolution took birth assaulting the traditional, ecological and biological input based farming. The fall back of traditional agriculture had been mainly due to advantages demonstrated by Chemical Agriculture viz., Chemical fertilizers being water soluble, plants could take them immediately, leading to faster growth. Micronutrients are used in traces to restore nutritional disorders; They being concentrated, small quantity could be applied in larger area, in comparison to organic manures, which are required in bulk quantity. Chemical agriculture dominated traditional organic farming with these two advantages only. But, over a period of time, we started experiencing damaging effects of chemical applications. The “evils” of synthetic- and chemical- pesticides has been a major concern to environmentalists. Farmers and researchers started working on renovation of organic farming techniques. Out of many initiatives, “Biodynamic Farming” incorporated the principles of Homeopathy, which is based on use of, minimum doses. Biodynamic Agriculture, special BD preparations are

made and are used in minimum doses, Incidentally, it must be realized that, even in chemical agriculture, there are substances like plant growth regulators and plant protection chemicals that are used in very small quantities, with one exception that, they are diluted but not “dynamised” to “potentise” the substance that is being used. Dynamisation or potentisation is unique aspect of the science of Homeopathy as experience reveal that simple dilution, at higher levels is not effective but becomes so, after undergoing the process of trituration or succussion.

The application of homoeopathy in agriculture is known as agricultural homoeopathy, which offers an ecologically and economically viable model with the potential to reduce the use of agrochemicals in world agriculture. Homoeopathy in plants contributes to the improvement of internal processes to optimise their growth and development Horticultural fruit crops are of great interest in agricultural industry due to their high consumption worldwide either fresh or canned, so it is important to increase their production.

Homeopathic potentization is the process consists of highly diluted substances, such as plant or animal extracts or minerals, which are stepwise diluted and vigorously succussed. Now research in homeopathic potencies is of great interest to organic agriculture since this way of treatment relies totally upon natural substances and essential self-regulation principles. Therefore homeopathic potencies are used

by the researcher of all over the world to investigate its utility in organic plant production. However, the primary condition for such use is that plants are not able to react to homeopathic dilutions. Homeopathic potencies involve successive logarithmic dilution steps decimal (1:10), centesimal (1:100) a potencies. Above a certain dilution step, there are virtually no molecules of the original substance left (potency levels higher than 24x respectively 12c). Ultra-highly diluted (UHD) substances defined as dilutions that are highly unlikely to contain any molecules of the Original material may still yield biological effects (Davenas et al., 1988). Effect of different homeopathic preparations on plant growth studies aimed to rule out the placebo effect from the homeopathic phenomenon, but also at the identification of therapeutic effect on various plants (Kleijnen et al., 1991, Cuchera 2000). These studies allowed extending the boundaries of the practical use of homeopathy including its use in the farming industry. Most criticism concerns whether treatments, in particular, ultra-high dilutions (where the concentration of the original substance is beyond the Avogadro limit) have any real biological effect. Moreover, there is no complete theory to provide a plausible explanation for the action of homeopathic potencies (Chibeni et al., 2001). Primarily on the specific effects of ultra-molecular dilutions (beyond the Avogadro limit) needs to be judged. Homeopathy has always been a subject of discussion, and after the debate taken up after meta-analysis published in *The Lancet* (Linde et al., 1997). After this publication, fundamental methodological problems about the meta-analysis have been detected (Rutten et al., 2005). Beneficial effects of different Homeopathy not only used as medicines but also applied in agriculture in this modern era. Potentised substance (Arsenic trioxide, Gibberellin acid, Lysine, Sodium Chloride, Copper Chloride) were used in the plant for germination, growth, and development of the plant. Effects were reported with decimal, and centesimal potency levels ranged from 5c to 24c. The studies aimed to understand the effectiveness of homeopathic medicine and also identification of therapeutic effect on different plants. These studies allowed extending the boundaries of the practical use of homeopathy including its use in the farming industry. This review covers the use of potentised Creative Commons Attribution License, which permits 1991, Cuchera et al., 2002, Taylor et al., Botanical trials are not susceptible to the placebo effect nor ethical problems and rely on almost inexhaustible sources of biological materials (2008). Complementary medicine centers essentially on the specific effects of ultra-molecular dilutions (beyond the Avogadro limit), which are judged to be impossible according to conventional science, although there is emerging evidence for *in vitro* activity of ultra-high dilutions. The pea seeds were stressed with the different centesimal potency of the well-known homeopathic remedy, *Arsenicum album*

(Swati et al., 2013). In this study, the effect of potentised homeopathic medicines on germination, growth and photosynthetic activity of pea (*Pisum sativum* L.) was investigated as compared to the untreated one (distilled water) (Baumgartner et al., 2004). Homeopathically prepared gibberellic acid was first tested on barley stalk length, with different results (Hamman et al., 2003).

The use of homeopathy in agriculture has been changing conventional agriculture to agroecological (Andrade et al., 2011), through the application of homeopathic preparations in different dynamization, following the Homeopathic Pharmacopoeia guidelines proposed by Hahnemann in 1810 (Hahnemann, 2013). The homeopathic dynamizations follow the principles of disintegration of matter and radiation without nuclear rupture, through the mechanical action on the smaller particles and addition of inert substances with dynamic activity, following the laws of electromagnetic waves: frequency, length and amplitude (Bonato, 2008). Homeopathic preparations can be applied on the soil and/or on the leaves (Santos et al., 2011; Andrade et al., 2012). These preparations can increase or decrease the production of bioactive substances due to its influence on the primary and secondary metabolism of medicinal plants modifying its phytochemical profile (Capra et al., 2014; Verdi et al., 2016). The application of nosodes and biotherapeutics are the most applied techniques in agro homeopathy (Jäger et al., 2010; Moreno et al., 2018).

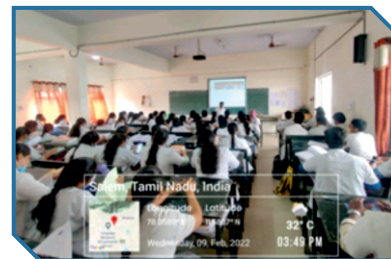
